1. Introduction [History of College]

Rabindra Mahavidyalaya, Champadanga, Hooghly founded on 8th of November, 1971 under the affiliation of the University of Burdwan. Initially, started with one two-storied building on the northern side with only eight students admitted to the Pre-University course and twenty-five students to the B.Com Pass course. B.A. course in the Pre-University and Degree level started in the academic session 1972-'73. During these four decades College now has developed a long list of infrastructure, namely five big buildings, two new buildings (under construction), Library has a Reading Zone for students and teachers, one playground, separate courts for playing volleyball, basketball and badminton, cycle-sheds, multi-gym, a potable water system and so on. College possesses a green ambience and a big pond in the middle.

Presently, it has 16 Hons. and 19 General subjects. College provides academic facilities like Learning Resource Centre, Computerized Library Facility, Career Counselling Cell, Smart Digital Classroom, etc.

In 2006, during First Cycle of accreditation College obtained a Grade of B by NAAC; on Second Cycle of assessment it was awarded with B⁺⁺ on 2017.

2. Objective & Scope of the Audit

Members along with the Principal, Dr Prasanta Bhattacharyya in presence of IQAC members at a preliminary meeting, held on 20-12-2023 at 11.30 am, outlines the broad objectives of the academic audit as an assessment of the College. Accordingly, the audit team members decided to look into the prevailing situation at the College along the following aspects in course of the audit.

Scope

- Methodology of teaching and learning adopted for the different courses run by the College
- Functioning of the Laboratories and Computer Facilities
- Examination and Evaluation system
- · Activities of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell
- · Central Library and the Central Research Facility and Sport Office
- Outreach Programmes by NSS as well as regular students.
- · Alumni/ae and their contributions to the College
- · Opportunities and Scope of improvements in the major functional areas

The team is empowered and expected to express their views and give suggestions for the improvement of the systems being followed by the College.

3. Methodology

At the meeting with the Principal, the Coordinator-IQAC, and other faculty members, officials, a discussion was made with the Principal which gave a general and broad profile of the facilities and activities of the College. The new facilities added and the new campuses that are in the process of being developed were also noted by the audit team.

The Audit team visited the various departments and facilities, and had brief interactions with the faculty of each department, and the support staff. Visits to the laboratories, Computer facilities, the Library and some of the other facilities of the College were accommodated in the schedule arranged by the College to enable the Audit Committee to acquire relevant first-hand information.

Based on the departmental profile, information/data from the available documents and the interactions with the Head/Coordinator relating to different components of the department/institution, the Audit Committee has made a sincere endeavour to put forward certain views, observations and recommendations in the body of this report with expectations that these recommendations, when implemented, will best serve the interest of the College as intended.

4. Institutional Distinctiveness

- The College was founded in 1971 and affiliated to the University of Burdwan.
- Since its establishment the College has made remarkable strides in the field of education in India based on the tenet's commitment, care and service.
- College provides free Wi-Fi facility with a bandwidth of 60 Mbps.
- Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) Data, at present library has a total of 36,718 printed books. Library uses KOHA, Web OPAC search facilities, INFIIBNET N-LIST consortia.
- No new minor or major projects during the year of assessment.

- College has introduced a number of Self-financing Vocational Training courses for creation/generation of job opportunities and become employable.
- Overall pass percentage is good.
- Most of the teachers are well-experienced and members of different boards of studies;
 23 teachers are awarded PhD.
- Few teachers pursue research works in their personal capacity.
- Orientation programmes for the new entrants should be organized.
- The support staffs are very happy with the College Administration.
- · The IQAC conducts its tasks efficiently.
- There are total 41 Classrooms, 2 Halls, 24 laboratories.
- Total no. of permanent teachers is 40 against 47 sanctioned posts, 37 SACT members and 23 non-teaching staff members.

5. College Campus& Facilities: College has the following campuses:

- a. Main Campus comprises -
- i) Administrative Building, Departments of English, Bengali, Sanskrit, Chemistry, Zoology, Commerce, Political Science and Computer Lab.
- ii) Vidyasagar Building: Central Library and Auditorium
- iii) Bigyan Bhavana: Departments of Physics, Geography, Microbiology, Economics
- iv) Bio Science Building: Department of Botany
- v) New Building: Department of Mathematics, Statistics and Education
- vi) Gymnasium Building: Department of Physical Education
- vii) Rammohan Bhavana: Department of Philosophy, Defence Studies, College Canteen and Students' Activity Building

The College comprises the total campus area of 7.94 Acres (3,45,866.4 sq. ft) with a built-up area of 72,360.82 sq. ft maintaining a green area of 2,73,505.58 sq. ft.

College has set the following Vision:

- Vision and Mission of the departments be revised mentioning the uniqueness, strength and opportunities of the departments.
- Student progression is satisfactory.
- Departments are conducting seminars/webinars on regular basis.
- Some topics relevant for UGC NET should be introduced in the existing curriculum.
- More Students' enrichment programmes be conducted for their benefit and exposure.
- Faculty members should be encouraged to publish their research articles in the UGC care listed journals.
- Teachers should take initiative to publish chapters in books, and in edited volumes.
- Senior faculty members will take initiative to incorporate the relevant new topics in the syllabi for the subject enrichment, skill orientation and more job opportunities and development of entrepreneurship amongst the students.

- Placement process, counselling be initiated by the College authority.

- A good number of teachers are having PhD and possess years of experiences in teaching, particularly in Botany, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, etc.
- Some academicians be invited for innovation in teaching-learning process/enrichment programmes for the benefit of the students.
- Initiative should be taken for more major/minor research projects
- Publication of research papers in reputed/UGC enlisted journals are less in number in Zoology; but in Chemistry and Botany it is quite a good in number.
- * Some faculty members of Physics are members of reputed social bodies.
- Students will be engaged in in-house projects/internship/field survey for experimental learning; Chemistry department may take initiative to publish the dissertation work of the students.
- Students of Chemistry may get exposure in evaluation of water quality parameters.
- Students' progression is good in Botany, Chemistry, Microbiology and Zoology. Teachers are requested to maintain more liaison with the students to keep their records of achievements/job etc.
- Logbook for each equipment be maintained and students must be equipped with the knowledge/knowhow to handle the instruments.
- Departments of Botany and Zoology may take initiative to build up one museum for keeping/preserving the herbarium/plant and animal specimens, etc.
- Students be encouraged for preparation of competitive examinations.
- Research activities be strengthened amongst the faculty members.
- Department should choose more skill-oriented courses, field-oriented studies for the students; new practicable proposal in skill enhancement needs enhancement.
- Microphone and white board to be installed in the class rooms.

B.Com

- Vision of the Department be more focussed.
- Mission be oriented towards the vision of the department.
- More hands-on/skill-oriented courses be initiated to cater to the need of the students.
- Students may be involved in the process of evaluation of works/performance of the local bodies/Govt. sector/Municipality.
- Social engagement of the students is necessary.
- Computer-Student ratio be enhanced.
